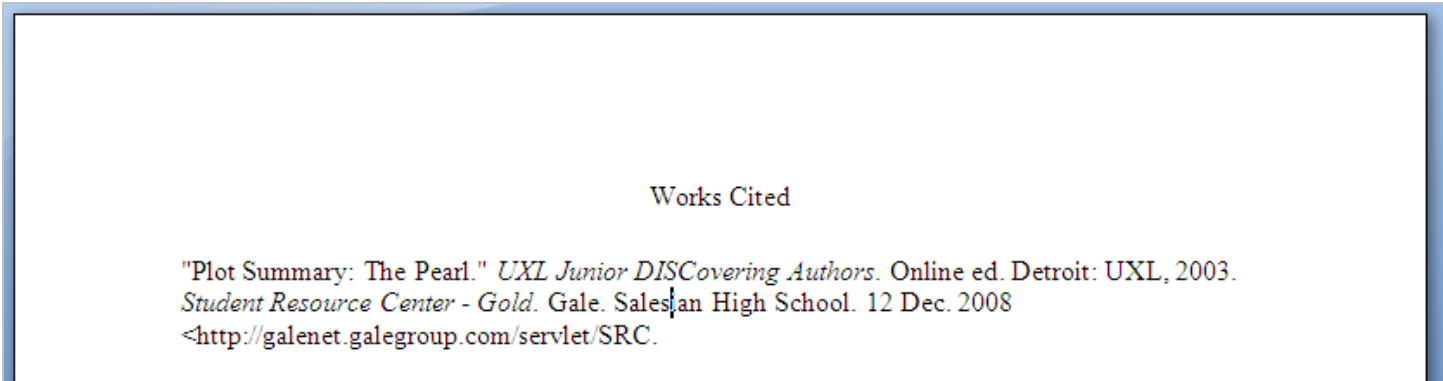
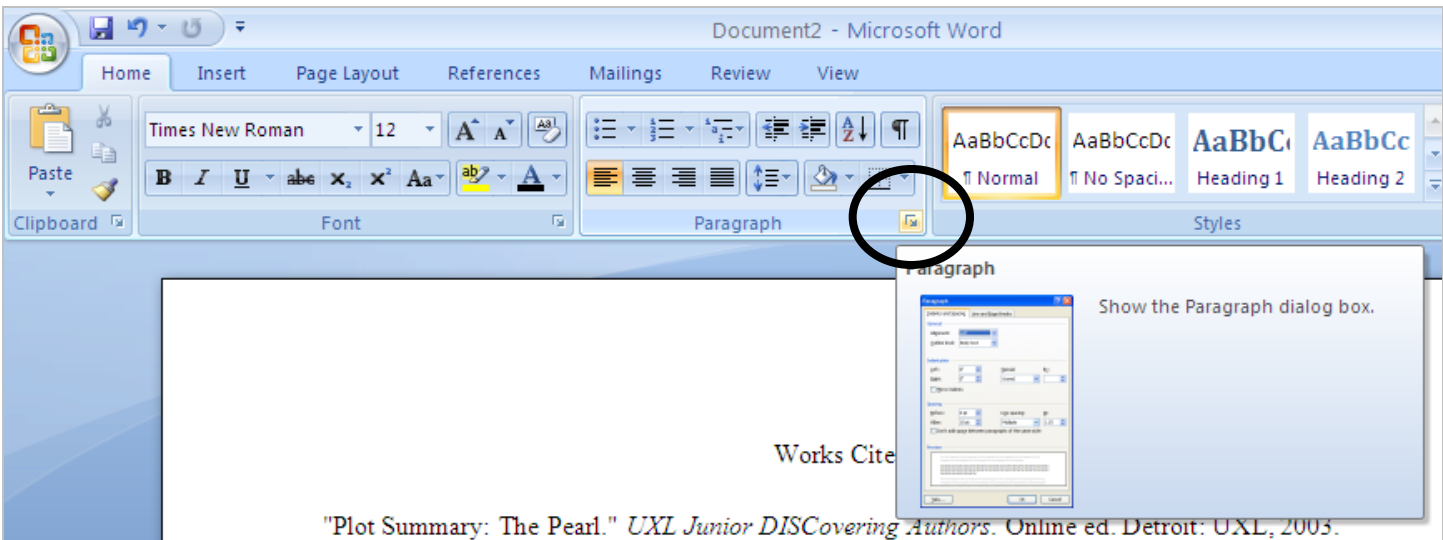


# Creating a Hanging Indent for your MLA Term Paper – MS Word 2007

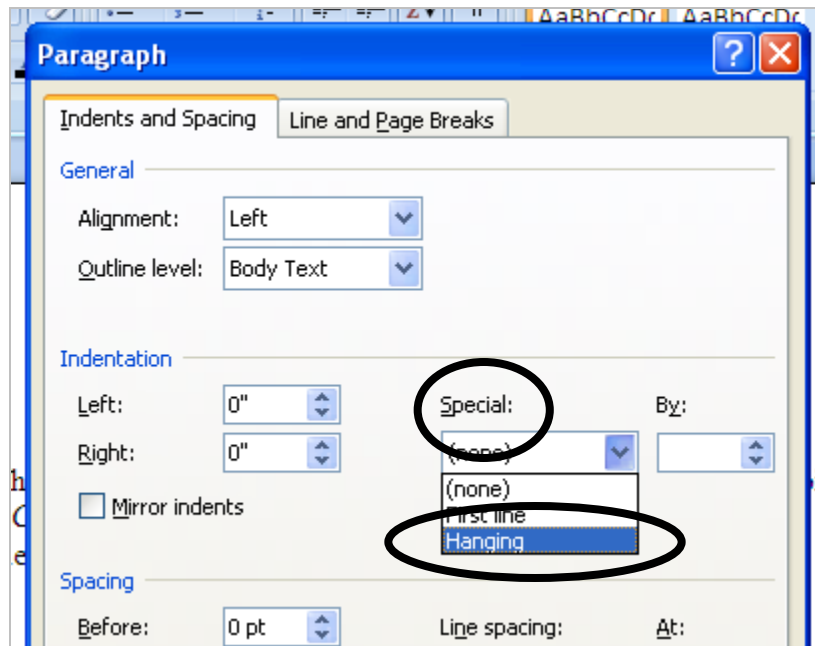
Place your insertion point anywhere in your citation.



On the ribbon bar, click the **Home** tab, then click the arrow in the lower right of the **Paragraph** section, shown below.



When the **Paragraph** dialog box opens, find the **Special:** drop-down box and choose **Hanging**.



Repeat for your other citations. Do not forget to alphabetize your citations.

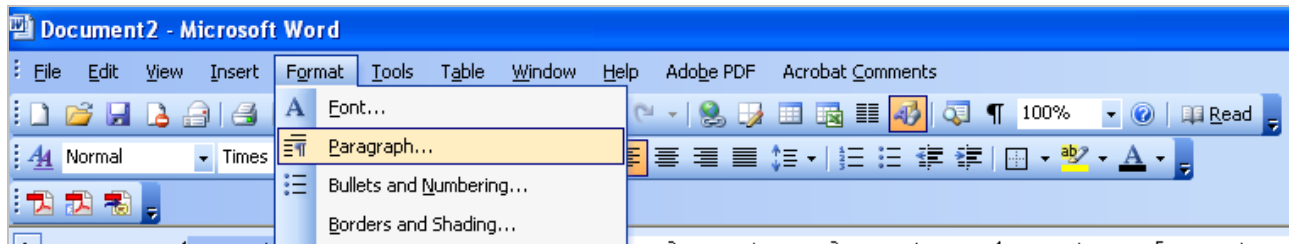

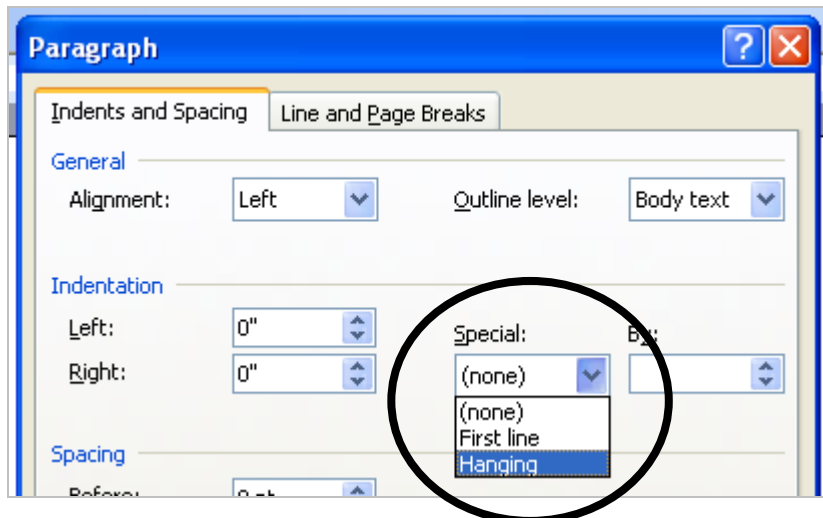
